Important notes to the fall start-up dates schedule

1. The ISD Sports and Activities Program is a large and at times complicated set-up to understand. With over 90 teams and groups participating in four different sport areas, both competitive and non-competitive, it will be important for you to know what's on offer for which ages on which days and times, how to register and pay, what the annual schedules look like and what will generally be expected of you/your child. Our staff will be ready to lead you through this process at the beginning of the school year. For now, please note the information found in these pages and be sure to visit our website to give yourself a better overview on how we operate. The Parents Info Night is an important opportunity for new parents to gain valuable information about our ISD Sports and Activities Program, including structure, expectations, policies/procedures, offerings and the registration process. It is also a chance to meet our staff and ask questions. It is highly recommended that all parents attend. Older students are welcome too.
3. The NECIS/ISST General Meeting is open to all parents of participants in our international schools, competitive sports program and will be focused on planning for the upcoming year to include housing, travel, Lions Club volunteering, scheduling, tournament hosting and costs. It will be an opportunity to better understand how we operate, meet new people and get involved.

6. The ISD Sportverein registration dates listed above represent times when new ISD soccer players can submit their additional soccer association paperwork, which can be downloaded from the registration website.
7. Registering and paying does not guarantee placement in our program. The final list of team and group participants is determined by the Sports and Activities Program and all groups are capacity controlled. Should your child not get into their requested activity/ies, we will work with you in an attempt to find suitable alternatives.
